The Pastor's Page

Dear Members and Friends,

As I was walking around the church yard the other day, I couldn't help but notice how beautiful our corner at the intersection of Jerome Street was looking. We have become a bright spot in this little section of Atlanta. However, I wondered if we indeed are that "shining city on the hill" described in John Winthrop's sermon to the Massachusetts Bay Colony in 1630 and made famous by President Ronald Reagan. The Metaphor is about being a beacon of hope, a blessing, to those around you, your community, your country, and the world. God only knows such light and hope is needed in these times. But what does be a blessing mean?

I was meditating this morning with a little book by the Irish poet John O'Donohue, called "To Bless the Space Between Us". A few things struck me that I think are worth sharing today. ..." There is a kindness that dwells deep down in things; it presides everywhere, often in the places we least expect. The world can be harsh and negative, but if we remain generous and patient, kindness inevitably reveals itself. Something deep in the human soul seems to depend on human kindness."

O'Donohue goes on to say that despite all the darkness in this world our hope is based on our kindness and light and that... "This is the heart of blessing. To believe in blessing is to believe that our being here, our very presence in the world, is itself the first gift, the primal blessing....A blessing is a constant flow of emergence. In other words, a revelation of God's love.

Jesus said, "Be the salt and the light." When the world is mean, dark, and negative we are to be the seasoning that helps others taste Godliness and be the light that shines his goodness and reveals the colors of his love, kindness, and compassion.

"The beauty of blessing is that it recognizes no barriers...that separate us. This can often be the key to forgiveness. Forgiveness is the only way forward to free us and a society from entrenched fear, anger, hurt and resentment.

Remember when I offer you the peace of Christ during the service, I'm giving you a direct blessing from Christ. And when you offer the same peace to those near you; you are offering the same blessing directly from Christ. It's not a time to make lunch plans or think about mowing the grass or watching the game. It's a sacred time directed by the spirit of Christ within us.

Eastertide ends this Sunday with the beginning of the season of Pentecost. I've been talking these past few months about living a resurrected life and what that looks like. Being a blessing to others in our everyday circumstances of life is very much a hallmark of the resurrected life.

Galatians 5:22-23 describes this perfectly... "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control..."

I think our corner at the intersection of Jerome Street is a blessing of light and hope to each other and to the Atlanta community.
